Project Dawn Kit Distribution

The Morrow County Health District, in partnership with Maryhaven, is proud to promote the Project Dawn opioid overdose training, education, and naloxone distribution program. Naloxone (also known as Narcan) is a life-saving drug that can reverse the effects of an opioid overdose when administered in time.

Individuals who know someone who is at risk for opioid overdose, and individuals who are at risk of opioid are encouraged to participate in the program. At-risk individuals include those who are in recovery for opioid addiction and those who are actively using opioids.

The training includes education on how to recognize the signs and symptoms of an opioid overdose, how to respond to an overdose by calling 911 and giving rescue breaths, and how to administer naloxone as a nasal spray. At the conclusion of the education session, participants receive a free kit containing two doses of naloxone. The opioid overdose education and naloxone distribution program is in response to the heroin epidemic facing Ohio. Kits are provided by the Ohio Department of Health.

Maryhaven and the Delaware-Morrow Mental Health and Recovery Services offer a range of treatment options and support services for individuals and families struggling with addiction. For more information about counseling services call 740-203-3800.
